Purpose of the Journal

The aim of the *Swiss Journal of Sociology* is to provide a means of collecting data and analyses relating to Switzerland and thus reflect research in the social sciences in that country. Notwithstanding this priority, the Journal is fully open to foreign authors, regardless of whether their work is connected with Switzerland.

The Journal neither favours nor excludes any research orientation. Articles are chosen for publication by the Editorial Committees assisted by referees.

Manuscripts submitted to the *Swiss Journal of Sociology* should not be simultaneously offered to other journals.

Notes for Contributors

The publisher and Editor of the *Swiss Journal of Sociology* request authors to follow the guidelines below when preparing manuscripts. The Editor may return manuscripts not in accordance with these guidelines so that the necessary modifications may be made.

1. Articles submitted for publication should not exceed 70'000 characters, footnotes and references included. They should be accompanied by an abstract of approximately 650 characters.
2. Four typed copies should be submitted. A diskette, with indication of the type of word processing used, should also be sent, but only *after acceptance* of the article and any necessary changes.
3. The first name and surname of the authors as well as their institutional affiliation(s) and addresses, and the title of the article, should appear on a separate page. The authors should not be identifiable in the body of the article, even from footnotes or references. The abstract should be submitted on a separate page, preceded by the title of the article and the name(s) of the author(s).
4. The bibliographical references should be cited within the text (not in the form of footnotes) along with the relevant page numbers, according to the following style: ... Durkheim ... ([1897] 1930, 23–38) or (Phelan et al., 1995, 130 f.; Haferkamp, 1987a, 150 ff.).
5. In the bibliography, at the end of the manuscript, all references mentioned in the text, and these only, should be listed with full details.

Each reference should include, in the following order, the surnames and forenames of all authors, the year of publication, the title of the book or periodical in italics, and the town and name of the publisher, according to the examples below:

Books: Durkheim, Emile ([1897] 1930), *Le suicide*, Paris: PUF.

Articles from journals: Phelan, Jo; Bruce G. Link, Ann Stueve and Robert E. Moore (1995), Education, Social Liberalism, and Economic Conservatism, *American Sociological Review*, 1/60, 126–140.

Articles from collective works: Haferkamp, Hans (1987a), Angleichung ohne Gleichheit, in: Bernhard Giessen and Hans Haferkamp, Ed., *Soziologie der sozialen Ungleichheit*, Opladen, Westdeutscher Verlag, 146–188.

6. Footnotes, numbered continuously, should be used only for brief comments and not for bibliographical references, nor for tables or illustrations.
