Tate) was composed by Purcell in 1680, and first performed "at Mr. Josias Priest's Boarding School at Chelsea by Young Gentlemen," no doubt with outside help as regards chorus and orchestra. Mr. W. H. Cummings says concerning it: "The choruses in 'Dido and Æneas' are remarkable for their melodiousness and adaptability for stage purposes. . . The final chorus is particularly beautiful, forming an appropriate close to Dido's Death Scene, in which she sings one of the most pathetic songs ever composed."
