SWISS YODLERS' VISIT TO LONDON.

As announced elsewhere, our Colony will shortly receive the visit of the Yodler Treble Quartet "Am Bachtel" (Zürcher Oberland) who, in conjunction with the Swiss Choral Society, London, will give a Concert at Wigmore Hall, 36, Wigmore Street, W.1., on Saturday next, October 23rd. Furthermore, two "Celebrations of the Yodlers' visit to London" will be held, one on Friday, October 22nd at the Union Helvetia Club, and the other on Sunday, October 24th at the Swiss Club "Schweizerbund." In addition, arrangements have been made with the British Broadcasting Company by which the Yodlers will broadcast one or two Yodel songs from the B.B.C.'s London Station on Friday, October 22nd, at 8.30 p.m.

Although yet unknown to a good many of our Compatriots in London, the Yodler Treble Quartet "Am Bachtel" has a record of which it can justly be proud. At the Swiss Yodel Festival in Berne (1921) the Quartette was awarded the 1st prize. Two years ago in Basle, on a similar occasion, their 1st Yodler, Mr. H. Bertschinger, was heading the list of competitors, and their 2nd Yodler, Mr. O. Koller, obtained the 3rd prize. In addition, the Quartette has given concerts with great success in Zurich (Tonhalle Pavillon), Berne, St. Gall, Basle, Winterthur, etc. In 1924 the Quartette gave a concert in Strasburg before an audience of over 2,000 people in respect of which the critic of the *Strasburger Zeitung* wrote as follows:

...Die Sanger des Quartetts sind von seltener Gute, die Tenore brillieren, die Basse begleiten mit schonem Wohlklang, es ist eine Ausgeglichenheit, sei es im starksten Forte oder im weichsten Pianissimo. Ihr vorzuglicher Jodler, H. Bertschinger, steigt mit voller Sicherheit und biegsamer, angenehmer Stimme in die hochsten Jodelungen hinauf und das Quartett begleitet diskret. Das Strasburger Publikum, hingerissen im hochsten Enthusiasmus, hat die Sanger immer und immer wieder mit sturmischen Applaus zu Dreingaben herausgerufen.

Lovers of our fine Swiss Folksongs and Yodels may, therefore, be assured of an enjoyable evening, either at Wigmore Hall or at one or the other of the Clubs.

It is advisable to book seats in advance. B.O.

SWISS GYMNASIC SOCIETY.

Wrestling Competition, Wednesday, September 29, 1926.

With reference to the results given in our last issue, the following lines will complete the report; they were received too late to be included in our last week's issue:—

What was probably one of the most successful wrestling tournaments held this year in England, both from the point of view of attendance as well as from the number of competitors, and the quality of wrestling, was decided on Wednesday, the 29th September at the Union Helvetia, organised by the Swiss Gymnastic Society, London.

The feature of the evening was the Welterweight Amateur Wrestling Championship of England, Catch-as-Catch-Can style, won by V. Benson. Although the weight was 11 stone 4 lbs., the Swiss Gymnastic Society was represented by two featherweights, R. Jacquenoud, 9st. 8 lbs., and F. G. Rohner, 9 st. 10 lbs. The former was very unfortunate in falling outside the mat in the course of his bout with A. E. Bacon, thereby falling on the side of his head, and although continuing in a dazed condition, he put up a fine fight, but was eventually beaten. F. G. Rohner won his preliminary bout with W. Owen with ease and met Bacon in the Semi-final. This was probably the best bout of the evening, Rohner showing true Swiss pluck and

skill; he had the misfortune of the Referee not being at the spot where he had obtained a good fall, and lost eventually, through over anxiety, after 7½ minutes' although leading well on points.

In the other competitions, the most pleasing feature for the Swiss Gymnastic Society was the good form shown by the new young members: for instance, L. Wallis (15 years) got into the final of the 8 st. 7 lbs. competition and was only beaten by a much older and more experienced opponent, W. A. Crow and E. A. Collet both did very well. W. Schneeberger unfortunately still feels the effects of the accident he had two months ago and although he got into the final of the 10st. open competition, had to withdraw after having lost the first bout of the final, in order to avoid unnecessary pain to his disabled finger. In summing up, there is every prospect of a successful campaign for the wrestlers of the Swiss Gymnastic Society in 1927.
