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outstanding, though undoubtedly a considerable number of these will be obtained eventually. Mr. Suter said he would go into the financial situation of the Group more fully in November, when there would not be quite such a long agenda before the meeting, as there was this month.

Mr. J. Baer, the President, then brought the various communications of the Committee before the Meeting. Dealing firstly with Dr. Egli's lecture on "The Revision of the Alcohol Legislation in Switzerland," he read numerous letters we had received in connection and also proposed drafts of a Resolution to be placed before the meeting after the lecture. These drafts were discussed by the Council, and a final one was drawn up and approved. A letter was also read from the Swiss Minister, M. C. R. Paravicini, expressing his interest in the lecture and kindly consenting to take the chair on the occasion of it.

Passing from Dr. Egli's lecture to miscellaneous correspondence, Mr. Baer read a letter from Mr. G. Weber with regard to an interview he had had with Dr. A. Lätt, when in Switzerland in the summer. Dr. Lätt had suggested that it might be a good thing if we could arrange to get an Englishman to lecture on Pestalozzi at University College next February, in celebration of his centenary. This suggestion was most favourably received by the meeting, and it was decided that a Pestalozzi Committee should be formed to deal with all the necessary arrangements. Mr. Beckmann, Mr. Deutsch and Mr. G. Weber very kindly agreed to serve on this Committee.

Mr. Baer then read a letter from Mr. A. Perrochet giving his resignation as a member of the Group, owing to his return to Switzerland. The Council expressed their regret at losing Mr. Perrochet as a member, and a tribute was paid to the work he had done in connection with the Military Tax deliberations some years ago.

The attention of the meeting was then called to the correspondence which had been exchanged between the Secretariat and the Editor of the *Efficiency Magazine* in connection with various very misleading statements he had published in the October issue of his magazine, with regard to the inefficiency of Swiss methods of manufacture. The Council expressed their whole-hearted approval of the letter sent in this connection by the Committee, giving detailed information and statistics to prove how great is the efficiency of Swiss commerce and industry. It is hoped that this letter will be published in the November issue of the *Efficiency Magazine*.

SWISS MERCANTILE SOCIETY.
