*Der fünfzigste Todestag von Jakob Stutz (14. Mai 1927) hat das Interesse an dem beliebten Zürcher-Oberländer Volksdichter wieder belebt und die Erinnerung an seine originelle Mundartdichtung aufgefrischt. Aber nicht weniger als seine bekannten "Gemälde aus dem Volksleben" verdient seine Selbstbiographie "Siebenmal sieben Jahre" gelesen zu werden, insbesondere die psychologisch und kulturgeschichtlich wertvolle Jugendgeschichte. Eine sorgfältige Auswahl aus den lebensvollen Jugenderinnerungen des Verfassers legt der Zürcher Verein für Verbreitung guter Schriften in seinem Augustheft vor, mit einigen knappen Anmerkungen und einem willkommenen biographischen Nachwort von Prof. P. Suter versehen. Das empfehlenswerte Büchlein gewährt einen tiefen Einblick in das volkstümliche Denken und Glauben im Anfang des neunzehnten Jahrhunderts, in die verkehrte Schul- und Familienerziehung und die geistige Beschränktheit der Masse jener Zeit. In einer verständnislosen Umgebung sehen wir einen begabten Knaben sich in seine Kinderträume einspinnen und unter den harten Stössen der Aussenwelt zusammenzucken. Wir verstehen, dass die mannigfachen Wirrnisse in Stutzens Leben zum guten Teil von denen verschuldet sind, denen seine Jugend anvertraut war, und werden uns der eigenen Verantwortung gegen die Seelen unserer Kinder bewusst.

GIUSEPPE CUSI †

On the 25th August last in a nursing home in Canton Ticino, there passed away Mr. G. Cusi, one of the best known and most popular members of the Ticinese and Swiss Colony in London. Born 72 years ago in the village of Olivone (Tessin) he emigrated to London early in the seventies of last century to take up a position with the Bros. A. and S. Gatti at the Royal Adelaide Restaurant. By his energy, industry and keen business instinct he soon rose to a much coveted position. Leaving his employment early in the nineties to try for himself, after severe struggles and setbacks over which he triumphed with indomitable will and tenacious determination, he founded and conducted until lately the business which still bears his name at 72, Shaftesbury Avenue.

His most characteristic trait was his sincere and fervid patriotism; though he spent the whole of his active life in London his inner and most cherished thoughts were always of our dear Motherland, and his beloved native village, of their traditions, institutions and prosperity. Only in the middle of last month he insisted on being taken to "la festa cantonale di Ginnastica" held in Mendrisio, to take part in the patriotic manifestations, and listen to the inspiring speech of our President, M. Motta.

He has been an active member of almost every Swiss Society in London. He was a veteran of the Unione Ticinese, which he joined as far back as 1880, being first elected President in 1891. He again presided over it repeatedly during the Great War, and splendidly upheld its interests, good name and prestige.

Practising the principle of joining practice to precept, he personally contributed freely and set up subscriptions for every deserving patriotic benevolent and charitable cause. A munificent gift of his made possible the foundation of "Ospizio Humanitas" in his hamlet of Sommascona-Olivone for the care and welfare of sickly and needy children of Canton Ticino.

His demise is all the more sad as with him has departed the last scion of a distinguished family, which for many centuries, as shown in the local archives and chronicles, has always striven in the forefront for the good and wellbeing of their village and district. He was laid to rest in his family tomb in Olivone on the 28th of August, amidst a general manifestation of regret and deep sympathy. R.I.P.
