Mr. Magnus Wehrli, Lausanne: "About Politeness." Mr. Max Kern, Zurich: "A Journey on Ice."

A Lecture was given by Miss S. Moshkowitz, Barrister-at-Law, Lincoln's Inn, on "Reminiscences of Modern Russia" on December 16th. A very interesting Lecture by a Russian lady who was present at the downfall of Czarism and the start of Sovietism. A vivid picture of the terror was described by this lady, and the causes of the Revolution were enumerated in a clear manner, without prejudice against either side.

GOLF.

It has been suggested to us that the many golf enthusiasts in the Colony might be grouped together for the purpose of a Competition which would be carried out somewhat on the following lines:—

The Competition shall be over 72 holes with full handicap. The winner shall be the one who returns the lowest net aggregate. Competitors are required to send in their handicap and the name of the Club to which they belong, but should they be anybody wishing to take part in this competition who has no official handicap or is not a member of any Club, he will be given an opportunity to hand in two cards and a handicap will be allotted to him. Partners will be drawn for, and will be required to keep each other's scores and be responsible for the correctness of same. Entry fee will be fixed at a reasonable figure according to the number of competitors.
