On Thursday, March 3rd, a Delegates' Meeting of the Swiss Sports Association was held at the Schweizerbund, 74, Charlotte Street, Mr. C. Barbezat, the President, opening the Meeting in the presence of 25 Delegates.

The programme for this year's Meeting, which is to be held at Herne Hill on Saturday, May 28th, was decided upon, and will be on much the same lines as last year.
