Dear Sir,—Referring to the letter over the signature of Mr. Borsinger, Chargé d'Affaires de Suisse, in your issue of Feb. 25th headed "Fête Nationale," would it be presumptuous on my part to suggest that now is the time for the different Swiss Societies in London to combine in an effort to arrange a real *Fête Nationale* in the Colony, so that it could take place on Aug. 1st and be supported by all the Societies.

It would not only give support to the admirable decision of the Swiss Committee for the National Festival, to collect for a Federal Fund for the Aged, which is indeed worthy of everyone's whole-hearted assistance, but it would be a mighty step towards bringing into closer contact the various Swiss Societies in London who never, through one reason or other, come together.

Surely the Swiss Colony in London is able to light a beacon on August 1st which is worthy of its name and its tradition. To let the Homeland know, that although we are far away from it, we are not made of any different wood, when it is a matter of Mother Helvetia and patriotic fire.

I feel sure that through the medium of the *Swiss Observer* and a little goodwill of the different Societies, the Fête Nationale of 1928 will be for the first time a real reminder of the meaning of August 1st.
