Dr. Hugo Teuscher, Zurich: "Women's Work." Mr. W. Jeanneret, Bienne: "The Birth of the Automatic Machine." Mr. Willy Frey, Lucerne: "Effective Advertising." Mr. Max Gysler, Zurich: "Sir Robert Baden-Powell."

**PERSONAL.**

The Swiss Minister has now returned to London from an extended trip to Egypt and Italy. He went to Cairo in the middle of January and stayed there with his brother. During his stay he had an audience with King Fuad of Egypt, who again manifested to him his great friendship for Switzerland. He was also received by their Excellencies the British High Commissioner for Egypt and Lady Lloyd. The Egyptian Prime Minister and other high functionaries favoured him with interesting interviews. From Cairo M. Paravicini went to Alexandria, where he visited the Swiss Schools and Club and was entertained by the members of the Swiss colony. He took the opportunity of visiting Luxor and Assoutan, where he inspected the principal historical monuments, including the tomb of Tutankhamen. He was very highly impressed with the magnificent treasures. On his return he visited Athens and then went on to Rome where he inspected the Swiss Guard and was shown around the Vatican by Colonel von Sury. Previous to returning to London he spent a few days in Berne, where an exchange of views took place between him and Federal Councillor Motta. He arrived in London on March 11th. Madame Paravicini is still in Switzerland and expects to join the Swiss Minister next week.
