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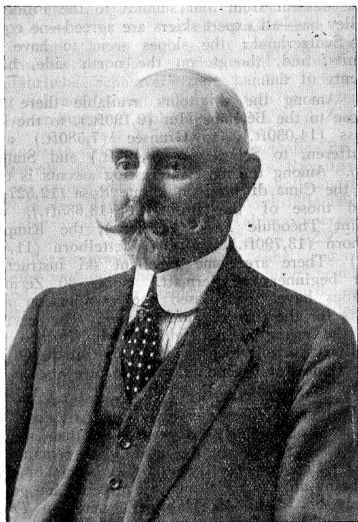
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HENRI HOESLI †

We very much regret to announce the death of our compatriot Monsieur Henri Hoesli, of 8, Love Lane, E.C.2 and 21, Buckingham Avenue, Whetstone, N.20.

Mr. Hoesli was taken ill on Wednesday, Feb. 20th, and removed to the Finchley Memorial Hospital. An operation for appendicitis was performed the following day by Sir Hugh Rigby, the King's Physician, and proved a complete success. Every hope for a speedy recovery was entertained when on the morning of Feb. 25th heart trouble set in, due, it is believed, to a slight attack of pneumonia from which he suffered about two years ago; he died the same afternoon.

M. Hoesli was born on July 29th, 1859 at Glaris, and educated at Zurich and Lausanne. He served his apprenticeship with the firm of Morey Deschamps in Paris, and subsequently travelled for them extensively on the Continent. From the year 1888 he represented that firm in London until 1892, when he started in business on his own. In the same year he married Frl. Ida Bardy, from St. Gall.

The deceased was extremely popular amongst a large circle of business and personal friends; his sterling qualities and his unflinching way of always looking at the bright side of life gained him access anywhere and the goodwill of all who came in touch with him. He was a member of—and financially supported—most of the Swiss societies and institutions in our Colony. He also belonged to the Chaucer Lodge of Freemasons.

Mr. Hoesli leaves a widow and a son. The cremation took place last Friday at 11 p.m. at the Golders Green Crematorium, the religious service being conducted by the Rev. Carl Hahn.
