The Turner collection, the work of the Pre-Raphaelites and of some of our living artists attracted special attention and interest.

DAS FROEHLICHE SCHWEIZERBUCH.

Herausgegeben von Werner Schmid.—(Zurich: Rascher).—Here is, something unexpected—an anthology of modern Swiss humour; for if German literature in general is not remarkable for comedy-writing German-Swiss literature has— in spite of certain notable exceptions, such as some of the short stories of Gottfried Keller—shared the same negative characteristic. Here more than 50 living German-Swiss writers have combined in a practical attempt to show that a sense of comedy and humour is very lively in Switzerland and can find expression in literature. Some of the contributions will be difficult for all but specialist readers for they are in the Swiss dialect, but there are enough poems and stories in modern High German to afford considerable entertainment. We liked Paul Burekhardt's comedy of the inefficient interpreter with his flock of tourists in Corsica. There is, too, a certain grim medical humour in Kaspar Freuler's story of the removal of his appendix, though perhaps the majority of readers would consider the subject hardly for joking. Konrad Falke's contributions approach almost a Gallic humour, and Heinrich Federer's story of the death of Innocent III. has an engaging portrait of St. Francis of Assisi. Finally, let us note the satirical poem on a Disarmament Conference, by Eugen Sutermeister, and the very homely verses of Ernst Zahn. There is not much really lively humour in this collection, but it seems comprehensive enough to be fairly representative.
