Home News—(Continued)

GLARUS.

M. J. F. Blumer-Kunz, manager of the "Vereingete Webereien Sennfält und Azmoos," has died. M. Blumer was a well-known and much estimated personality.

M. Karl Burret-Hurner, the oldest inhabitant of the canton of Glarus has died at the age of 101 years.

APPENZELL.

A fire which broke out at the furniture works of Frehner in Herisau caused considerable damage.

THURGAU.

The death took place at Weinfelden of M. Konrad Saameli, Manager of the Cantonal Bank. M. Saameli was 62 years old, and was for over 40 years connected with the Bank of which he was Manager for the last 25 years.

FOOTBALL.

The Swiss Football Association held their DELEGATES MEETING in Biel on 16-17th July. A proposal to change the present system made by the Geneva Clubs was lost.

The Annual Reports were accepted with the exception of the Report of the commission for protests and appeals (Rekurskommission) which was turned down and a vote of censure duly passed!

The "Student-paragraph" which caused so much trouble during the last season was deleted. Of all those registered last year under this paragraph, not one followed a course of studies at one of the Universities!

Two "foreigners" per team (against three previously) are only to play in future with National and First League Clubs.

No change of club will be sanctioned after 1st January.

Special rules have been drawn up, regulating the engagement of professionals.

A proposal to reserve three (amended to two) Sundays for training games for the National Eleven was turned down.

Proposals submitted for the re-organisation of the Association were referred back for further examination and study.

The Finalists for the Championship are to receive 12½% each of the gross receipts.

Referees will receive 30 francs per match.

F. C. Biel proposed to supplement the fixture list by creating an intermediate championship, giving the National and First League Clubs an additional eight games against clubs in the other group whom they would otherwise not meet. The proposal was accepted in principle, details are yet to be worked out. This is the most important decision taken. Seven home games for a National League club are obviously not enough to make ends meet. Four more are a reasonable addition.

International games are fixed at 20 within three years.

To balance the budget per 1932, the proceeds of an International Match are specially reserved.
