Paravicini, special efforts were being made by the Colony to collect a substantial sum towards this year's Federal Shooting Competition—"Tir Fédéral." A contribution of five guineas was thereupon voted from the funds of the London Section, the wish being expressed that the London Swiss Colony, as on former occasions, be again represented by a team.

The Meeting also decided its agreement in principle to hold again this year a First of August Celebration. It is contemplated that our National Day be feted by the whole Swiss Colony, and it is proposed that this function be held at the Botanical Gardens, Regent's Park.

This terminated the proceedings.

SWISS RAILWAY LOAN.

The loan of 100,000,000 frs. which the Swiss Federal Railways were authorised to issue to cover current deficits, failed to secure full subscription from the public. It is announced that only 75,000,000 frs. was subscribed by the public, the balance remaining on the hands of the underwriting banks.

In official circles this failure is attributed to the general crisis; to the fact that the issue coincided with the Paris and Vienna troubles; to the dearth of liquid assets owing to the decline of trade; and to the preference of investors for the older stock which has greatly depreciated, in the hope that there will be greater profits when conditions revive.

The newspapers, however, point out that nearly 1,000,000,000 frs. are hoarded in Switzerland in gold or banknotes. They urge that the lack of success of this loan is a warning to the Federal Parliament to take serious stock of the financial position of the country.
