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ceptionnels où une décision serait soustraite à la sanction des électeurs. Notre peuple possède une maturité politique qui l'autorise à prendre position à l'égard même de questions pratiques; lui dénier ce droit, c'est le décourager. Enfin, il importerait d'examiner soigneusement le décalage qui s'est insensiblement produit dans les compétences gouvernementales, et d'y remédier dans la mesure du possible.

Ces considérations amènent la Nouvelle Société Helvétique à préconiser la nomination d'une commission d'experts du monde de la science, de l'économie, de la politique, dont la tâche consisterait à poser les différents problèmes, à les limiter, à trouver le plan convenable sur lequel pourrait être édifié, plus tard, le projet de constitution nouvelle. Car il va de soi qu'il est trop tôt pour s'attaquer directement à celui-ci; commençons par débayer le terrain. Si nous ne le faisons, pas, les améliorations partielles que nous réaliserions seraient isolées, ne s'intégreraient pas dans l'édifice constitutionnel et compromettraient même son équilibre.

Et la Nouvelle Société Helvétique conclut, après avoir remarqué qu'une telle besogne, forcément de longue haleine, exigerait la collaboration raisonnée de tous, par ces paroles dignes d'éloge: "Au centre de cette entreprise, il faut placer l'idée que le maintien absolu de normes constitutionnelles est à soi seul déjà la condition sine qua non de l'existence de notre pays." On ne saurait qu'y souscrire et souhaiter de voir nos hautes autorités à Berne renoncer au régime de facilité dont elles vivent. Notre maison se lézarde: appelons les architectes pendant qu'il en est temps encore.

CHAMPION DRIVERS IN THE SWISS GRAND-PRIX

The importance of the event of the Fourth Swiss Grand-prix for automobiles, which the Swiss Automobile Club has fixed to take place on August 22 on the Bremgarten round track at Berne, is daily becoming more patent. The two main firms among German constructors, whose names have in the past headed the winning lists, viz. Mercedes-Benz and Auto-Union, have just sent in the names of their champions. They are sending to Berne their best racing teams, seeing that a very sharp contest will ensue in consequence of the shortening of total distance and those firms being in closest rivalry.

Mercedes-Benz have of course appointed their famous Rudolf Caracciola as leader, together with Manfred von Brauchitsch and Hermann Lang; the latter figuring already in the international list of victors. Further drivers for the Mercedes firm are the Swiss Christian Kautz and perhaps also the prominent Englishman Richard Seaman, who, in three consecutive years has won the Prix de Berne. (1934, 35 and 36.)

Auto-Union have so far named four drivers, who will have as their leader the winner of the Swiss Grand-prix of last year, Bernd Rosemeyer. The other competitors on behalf of the Auto-Union are Hans Stueck, Kurt Hasse and H. P. Müller.

Maserati cars will no doubt start as well. Negotiations with several Italian and French firms are yet being conducted by the race manager, Director W. Ed. Huber.

Alfa Romeo, a firm on whose account contradicting reports are circulating, will hardly fail to make an appearance.

TECHNISCHE CHRONIK UND INDUSTRIELLE NEUHEITEN.

Die Umschlagsanlagen des Kohlenhafens von Born am Julianakanal in Holland gestatten jährlich 2 Millionen Tonnen Kohlen umzuschlagen und zu lagern. Dabei finden 2 Waggonskipper Verwendung, deren elektrische Ausrüstung durch die Firma Brown, Boveri & Cie. A.G., Baden (Schweiz) geliefert worden ist. Das Betriebsergebnis für den ersten, im Jahre 1934 gelieferten Kipper war derart günstig, dass die holländischen Eisenbahnen im Jahre 1935 eine zweite Einrichtung bestellten. Diese zweite Verladeeinrichtung besitzt eine Tragkraft von 45 Tonnen. Die Ladeleistung beträgt 160—190 Waggons täglich bei einer Betriebszeit von 16 Stunden. Für das Hub- und Kippwerk sind zwei Motoren von je 155 kW. eingebaut. Das Kranfahrwerk wird durch einen Motor von 80 kW., das Portalfahrwerk durch einen solchen von 125 kW. angetrieben.

Die Flugzeuge der China Clipper Pan-American Airways, einer grossen amerikanischen Luftfahrtgesellschaft, die soeben den ersten Flug über den Pazifischen Ozean U.S.A.—China durchgeführt hat, sind ausschliesslich mit schweizerischen Chronometern der Firma Longines ausgerüstet. Die Zwischenlandungsplätze in Hawaii und Guan verwenden ebenfalls ausschliesslich Chronometer dieser Marke.

Die Firma Gebr. Sulzer A.G., Winterthur (Schweiz) hat im Jahre 1910 der Cereceria

Argentina Quilmes A.G. in Buenos-Aires einen doppelten Ammoniakkompressor mit einer Kälteleistung von 1.200.000 frig/h geliefert. Der Kompressor ist direkt mit einer ventilgesteuerten Sulzer-Dampfmaschine für 3-fache Expansion gekuppelt. Bis vor kurzer Zeit arbeitete der Kompressor nach dem sog. feuchten System. Letztes Jahr hat die Brauerei der Firma Sulzer den Auftrag gegeben, ihn für den Gang mit überhitzten Ammoniak-Dampf umzubauen. Es ist gelungen, damit die Leistung gegenüber vorher um 25% zu steigern.

Die beiden amerikanischen Flieger Dick Merrill und Jack Lambie, die kürzlich den Atlantik überflogen, haben sich dabei ausliesslich der Chronometer aus der Fabrik Longines bedient.

Die Western New South Wales Electric Power Pty. Ltd. hat für ihr Elektrizitätswerk in Broken Hill den siebenten Sulzermotor bestellt, da sie mit den sechs schon gekauften ausgezeichneten Erfahrungen gemacht hat. Dieser neueste Sulzermotor entwickelt mit 6 Zylindern von 650 mm innerem Durchmesser und bei einer Tourenzahl von 160 in der Minute 3.200 PS.

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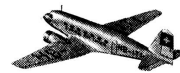
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
