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famous painting "Spring Pastures," by Giovanni Segantini, the greatest master of Alpine painting of the nineteenth century, has been lent by the Bollag Gallery, Zurich, and occupies a place of honour. "Spring Pastures" was painted a few years before the artist's death and is considered as one of his best works. It depicts the lonely grandeur of the mountain scene and shows a shepherd tending his flock on a high Alpine pasture.

A number of cartoons associated with celebrities show Gibbon at an evening party in Lausanne, Lord Byron on the Wengernalp where he wrote "Manfred," Lord Byron during a storm on the Lake of Geneva, Charles Dickens leaving Lausanne, John Ruskin contemplating the Rhine Falls with his father, and William Wordsworth looking at an avalanche coming down from the Wetterhorn. Facsimiles of pages from the old visitors' book of the Grand Hotel, Kronenhof, Pontresina, recording first ascents in the Engadine, are also shown.

In the section for models there is an Alpine rock garden, weighing five tons.

There is so much of interest in this collection that it is difficult to allot first honours to any special exhibit; I would declare Segantini's "Spring Pastures" the Queen of the Swiss Exhibition, with the Alpine Garden, designed and partly constructed by M. Selwyn Duruz of the S.F.R. as a good second. This picturesque garden is adorned with real Arolla pines and many hundreds of Swiss Alpine plants. The rock garden contains a waterfall, a stream as well as a little bubbling spring and is a very creditable reproduction of our Alpine uplands during the months of May, June and July. —

During the first week of the Exhibition more than 12,000 people have visited the Exhibition and the number is increasing daily. It is significant and a happy augury for the travel interests in Switzerland, that the visitors to this Exhibition belong to that section of the public which has the means to take a Swiss Holiday.

The authorities of the Swiss Federal Railways are heartily to be congratulated on their splendid and farseeing initiative to acquaint the English Public with some of the Art Treasures and works of Swiss arts and Crafts. A well-known Canadian Journalist prettily described the Exhibition as "Mountains come to Metropolis."

We warmly recommend our readers and their friends to pay a visit to Union House, they will not regret it.
