SWISS NATIONAL EXHIBITION.

The Watchmaking Trade at the Swiss National Exhibition.

If it could be ascertained which high grade Swiss product enjoys a universal reputation it would almost surely be found that the majority of votes would go to the Swiss Watch. The watchmaking trade, mainly at home in the big Jura villages and the towns on the skirts of the Jura, has made the name of Switzerland and the finest achievements of Swiss precision work known all over the world.

In the Swiss National Exhibition at Zurich (May 6th to October 29th, 1939) the Swiss watchmaking trade will be allocated a place of honour. After passing through the "Land and People" section of the Exhibition we arrive at a simple pavilion, possessing, however, an air of distinction, surmounted by a light belfry. But the trade will likewise occupy a special position: the thematic principles which govern the whole Exhibition are here abandoned, and the 44 most important firms are able to display their specialties and finest products in their own showcases. This was, indeed, the only way to obtain a representative display. The historical review on the ground floor of the methods of measuring time since antiquity and the highly interesting survey of the development of Swiss watchmaking will, however, be thematic.

In order to appreciate these fine works of art the visitor must give his whole attention to them and not allow himself to be distracted by anything else. For this reason the exhibition architecture in this section has been placed unreservedly at the service of the exhibits, which are displayed to the best advantage in the dim light of the upper stories in showcases carefully kept apart from one another. But the watch and clock pavilion of the Swiss National Exhibition will not be a mere "utility" building. The frescoes of the well-known west Swiss painter, A. Blanchet, will adorn the ground floor and the façade will be decorated with the sign of the zodiac by the Geneva enamel industry.

The most powerful locomotive in the world.

One of the chief sights of the Swiss National Exhibition at Zurich (May 6th to October 29th, 1939) will be the gigantic new locomotive of the Swiss Federal Railway which is now rapidly approaching completion. Its 12,000 h.p. (6,000 h.p. per unit) will give it twice the power of the biggest American railway engines. The weight of the most powerful of these, 220 tons, is only 24 t. below that of the new Swiss engine intended for the St. Gotthard line. King Boris of Bulgaria, on the occasion of his recent stay at a Swiss winter sports centre, availed himself of the opportunity of inspecting this coming electric marvel in the works. This brilliant achievement of Swiss engine-building and imposing exhibit of the Swiss National Exhibition will soon be placed in its finished state in the section "Switzerland, the World's Holiday Place." of the National Exhibition.
