THE NEW COUNSELLOR AT THE SWISS LEGATION IN LONDON.

(The following has been kindly supplied to us by the Swiss Legation).

M. Alfred Escher studied Law in Zurich, Kiel and Berlin; Dr. of Law of the University of Zurich; worked for one and a half years in an Insurance Company.

M. Escher became a member of the Staff of the Federal Political Department in 1931, and after four months at the Swiss Legation in London and one month spent in Singapore, was appointed Consul: Attaché in Bangkok (Thailand). Towards the end of 1935 he was transferred to Warsaw as Secretary of Legation; 1939 to 1941 he was Secretary of Legation in Berlin; 1941 to 1942 he held the same post in Ankara; in April 1942 he was appointed Consul in Baghdad, and Consul in Athens in 1944; he was promoted Counsellor of Legation end of 1944 and transferred to London in June 1945.
