FLT.-LIEUT. GUY MARTIN, D.F.C. †

Nous venons d'apprendre avec une profonde tristesse, que l'un de nos jeunes compatriotes Guy Martin, est décédé à Singapour le 3 mars à l'âge de 24 ans.

Né à Londres il fit toutes ses classes et son devoir au moment du danger comme un bon nombre de nos jeunes Suisses, il s'engagea volontairement dans la R.A.F. en 1941, fut décoré de la D.F.C., et gagna son grade de Flt.-Lieut. à la suite de nombreuses opérations sur l'Allemagne avec un avion Lancaster.

A Singapour il succomba en cinq jours, atteint de paralysie infantile, qu'hélas, si peu de malades arrivent à surmonter dans leur état général, et le travail très absorbant du service d'aviation.

Tout dernièrement encore, écrivant à ses parents M. et Mme Alfred Martin, 23, Musgrove Road, New Cross, auxquels nous présentons ainsi qu'à toute la famille notre grande sympathie, il annonçait qu'il était devenue membre du "Swiss Club" de Singapour, car à l'égard de son pays d'origine il avait toujours manifesté une vive et bien sincère affection.

During the war the school has remained open, and it numbers at present some 60 girls, half of whom are Swiss. The English Branch, which was opened at Shrewsbury during the war, is closing in April.

As soon as Exchange Control Regulations permit, pupils from England will be received again.
