**DR. PAUL PETTAVEL †**

The "Swiss Observer" deeply regrets to announce the death of Dr. Paul Pettavel, of "The Crozier," 38, Corkran Road, Surbiton, and 95, Harley Street, W.1, which occurred on the 14th of this month, at the age of 75.

Dr. Pettavel, who was an eminent surgeon and physician, came to this country in 1932 from Johannesburg, South Africa, where he enjoyed a great reputation, and his clinic was famous throughout the Union. The Swiss Government appointed him Hon. Swiss Consul in Johannesburg.

In his younger days the deceased was assistant to two famous surgeons in Switzerland, Professors Kocher and Roux. Amongst his numerous clientèle were many famous personalities.

Dr. Pettavel rendered valuable services to the Swiss community in London; he was a Honorary Member of the City Swiss Club.

Apart from his calling he found time to interest himself in literature and he was known as a connoisseur of art.

Dr. Pettavel intended shortly to retire to his native canton of Vaud, where he had acquired a property on the lake of Geneva.

All those who have known this lovable man will regret his passing, which is a great loss both to the Swiss Colony and our Country.
