Nestlé and Anglo-Swiss Holding Company will propose, at an extraordinary general meeting to be held on 5th December, an increase in the share capital by Swiss francs 7,200,000 to francs 65,200,000 by issuing at francs 525 72,000 new bearer shares of francs 100 each nominal.

This issue is in connection with the merger scheme with Alimentana. As already reported, shareholders in Alimentana, the holding company for the Swiss Maggi food concern, have been offered for each share 15 Nestlé shares and 15 shares in Unilac Incorporated, of Panama, a concern allotted to Nestlé and Anglo-Swiss Holding Company.

### Humanitarian

The "Kinderhilfe" of the Swiss Red Cross has organised further transports of children. On the 20th of this month 500 children from Austria have arrived in Switzerland, another batch from Italy is expected to arrive shortly in our country. They will stay for three months and will be distributed amongst Swiss families. [A.T.S.]

The Annual Seismological Report concerning Swiss earthquakes during 1945 has been compiled by Dr. E. Wanner, of Zurich. Seismographs are installed at the Swiss Observatories of Zurich, Chur, Neuchâtel, Basel and Brig, and during the year 85 near earthquakes and 189 strong distant earthquakes were registered. There were ten earth tremors with epicentres in Switzerland which were felt by people during the year. None of these had a greater intensity than V on the Rossi-Forel Scale, so that none reached destructive intensity. The greatest three tremors were (1) May 13th at Freiburg, (2) October 13th, at Engadine, and (3) November 10th, at Wildhorn.
