The International Tennis Championships of Switzerland on covered courts were organised in Geneva over the week-end of mid-November. Great interest was attached to them because of the famous German player Gottfried von Cramm, who disputed twice the finals in the Wimbledon Championships. Shooting.

The organisation for the World's Championships for shooting (rifle and pistol) has been attributed to the Argentine. The Swiss Team will be called upon to defend the valuable Mannerheim trophy, which is the prize for the best performance with the Army rifle of the organising country. There is a rule that the organising country should therefore lend some of their Army rifles to the countries who compete for this Mannerheim trophy, in order to enable them to get used to it. All countries have until now strictly adhered to this rule. When the Swiss Rifle Association recently asked the Argentinian for this rifle for training purposes, they were told that the Swiss should come to the Argentine to use them! This attitude is clearly contrary with good tradition and puts the other competitors at a big disadvantage.
