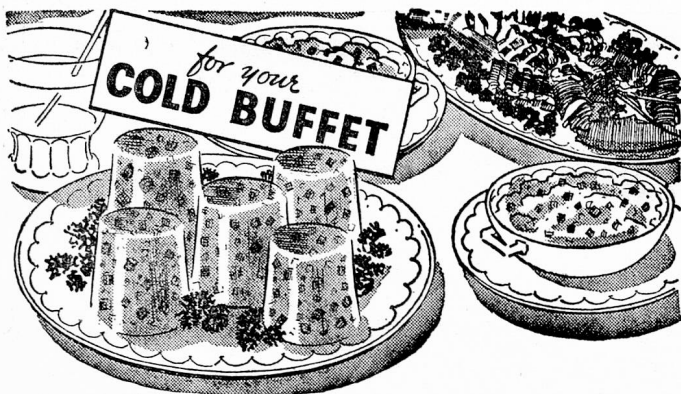

Monthly Meeting.

The Monthly Meeting of the City Swiss Club took place on Thursday, November 10th, at the Dorchester Hotel, Park Lane, W.1.

Mr. P. A. Moehr was in the Chair, and there were about 70 members present.

The President, towards the end of an excellent dinner, opened the Meeting by welcoming the guest of honour, the Hon. Josiah Wedgwood, head of the world-wide known Pottery factory, Josiah Wedgwood, Sons Ltd; of Barlaston; amongst other guests present, were M. V. Umbricht, Commercial Attaché at the Swiss Legation, and Colonel Rieser, Military Attaché.

Mr. Moehr gave a very concise and interesting *exposé* of the history and development of the firm of Josiah Wedgwood, Sons Ltd. since its foundation in 1612, and then informed the members that Mr. Josiah Wedgwood would give an address on "Britain's Economic Problems." As most of the lectures and addresses at meetings of the City Swiss Club, are to be treated as "off the record", it is sufficient to say, that the speaker gave a fair, if in part somewhat biased, *compte-rendu* of the present days problems with which the business community in this country is faced. After the address, which was accorded a hearty applause, an interesting discussion ensued in which various members of the Club took part.

The Meeting was closed shortly before 10 o'clock.
