HENRY DE TORRENTÉ.

Envoyé Extraordinaire et Plenipotentiaire de la Confédération Helvétique près de la Cour de St. James.

Président d'Honneur, of a number of Swiss Societies in Great Britain.



Anton Bon.

President: Swiss Benevolent Society.

Elected President of Society in 1940. President City Swiss Club 1943-1946. Member of 1st of August Committee. Governor Gordon Stoun School, Elgin (Scotland). Arrived in this country in 1936. Profession: Hotelier.



P. A. Moehr.
President: City Swiss Club.

Entered Committee in 1942 as Librarian. Hon. Secretary: 1943-1948. President: 1948. Arrived in London in 1920. Mr. Moehr is a Director of the Acme Transport Co., Ltd., in London.



E. STEINER.

Chairman: Swiss Economic Council.

Since inception of the erstwhile Council for the Study of Swiss Problems, now known under the above name, its Chairman. Vice-President: City Swiss Club (1946-49) Trustee: Swiss Mercantile Society.

Entered firm of Messrs. Volkart Bros., Winterthur, in 1895, transferred to London Office 1896, Bombay Office in 1897 and Madras Office in 1910. Returned to London Branch as Manager in 1914. Retired from his post in 1946.



Dr. H. W. Egli.
President: Nouvelle Société Helvétique.

Elected President in January, 1947. Editor: "Swiss Observer," 1928/29. Took the initiative for the formation of an Assembly of Presidents of Swiss Societies in Great Britain, and when constituted was elected Chairman. Has also taken initiative for founding a Swiss Social Centre (the realisation of this project is still pending). First came to England as a student in 1919, returned in 1924, as correspondent of "Der Bund" Berne, at present Chief Foreign Correspondent of the "Neue Zürcher Zeitung."

Dr. Egli took over the presidency of the "Nouvelle Société Helvétique in 1947 in order to save this Society from self-extinction, with the support of many others of like mind.



MRS. C. BERTI.

President: Ladies Section, Unione Ticinese.

Served on Committee for 9 years as Vice-President, since 1949, President.


Mrs. Berti is showing a keen interest in the "youngsters" of the Swiss Colony, who find in her an always willing adviser.



C. Berti.

President: Unione Ticinese.

Elected President in 1947, Member of U.T. for 38 years, served on the Committee for 28 years. Member of Committee "Swiss Home," Vice-Chairman "Swiss Catholics" in London. Restaurateur. Arrived in this country in 1902.



W. MEIER.

President: Swiss Mercantile Society.

Entered Society in 1928. Elected in 1930 a member of the Education Department Committee of which he became Chairman in 1935. President of the Society in 1947. Hon. Secretary of Assembly of Presidents of Swiss Societies in Great Britain. Since 1928 in this country. Mr. Meier is Manager of a Metal Merchants firm in London.



R. DE CINTRA.

President: 1st of August Committee.

Member of City Swiss Club since 1913. Held office of Hon, Treasurer for many years. President City Swiss Club: 1922, 1947 and 1948, Steward Swiss Benevolent Society. President "Cercle Genevois," Hon, Treasurer, Swiss Economic Council. Arrived in this country in 1912. Mr. de Cintra is Chairman and Managing Director of the firm of Messrs. Dimier Brothers & Co., Ltd., London.



CH. L. CHAPUIS.

President: "Fête Suisse" Committee.

For over 30 years prime mover of the "Comité de la Fête Suisse"; held posts of Hon. Treasurer and of later years President. Joined City Swiss Club in 1911 and was President in 1930. Honorary Member Swiss Mercantile Society, which Society he joined in 1908, was President of the Entertainment Committee of the S.M.S. for 11 years, Member of the Council for 15 years and is still on the Advisory Board of the Employment Dept. Arrived in this country in 1891, at the age of ten, and is a Director of Messrs. H. Comoy & Co., Ltd., Pipe Manufacturers. It is worth recording that Ch. L. Chapuis was awarded the "British Red Cross" War Medal after the 1st World War 1914-1918.



F. G. Sommer.

President: Swiss Male Choir.

Elected President in 1940. President of Swiss Y.M.C.A. 1928-30. Vice-President and latterly President of the Foyer Suisse, 1924-1949. Vice-President 1st of August Committee 1947-1949. Member of the Consistoire of the Swiss Church, 1938-49. Came to this country in 1916.

Mr. Sommer is Incorporated Company Accountant and Corporate Secretary of Messrs. A. Wander, Ltd., in London.



R. Dupraz.

President: Swiss Sports Committee.

Mr. Dupraz was elected in 1912, a Member of the General Committee of the Swiss Benevolent Society. Hon. Treasurer from 1914-1924, President from 1924-1938, was nominated Honorary Vice-President for services rendered. Arrived in this country in 1905, and holds a leading position in the firm of Dimier Brothers & Co., Ltd., London.


Mr. Gandon is also a Member of the 1st of August Committee and the "Fête Suisse" Committee.

President: Confrèrie Vaudoise.



President: Swiss Orchestral Society.

Mr. Pellet has for many years worked together with Mr. E. P. Dick, Conductor of the Swiss Orchestral Society, in bringing this Society to its present high level.

Member of the 1st of August and "Fête Suisse" Committees.




A. Boog.

Since 1919 in this country. Signature holder, Swiss Bank Corporation, London.




CHARLES F. ILLI.
