#### SOPHIE WYSS RECORDINGS.

For almost a quarter of a century now has Swiss musical art been most ably represented in England by Sophie Wyss. She has not had much support from our Colony — in fact hardly any worth speaking of. But she has made her way by sheer ability and love for her art. Long since she has become one of the foremost exponents of modern English composers, such as Benjamin Britten and Mathias Seiber, as well as of classical and modern Continental song writing.

She has never neglected an opportunity to sing also Swiss compositions, old and new, including folksongs and such simple things as "Dalcroze." But it is not surprising that her interpretation of the great French masters of our time, such as Fauré, have brought her better reward at concerts, on the B.B.C.

and also in gramophone records.

It gives us pleasure to draw our readers attention to a particularly successful recent recording by Sophie Wyss of a famous song-cycle "La Bonne Chanson" by Fauré. It is definitely not for the many-headed, but the discerning few find great delight in this work and its interpretation by our compatriote, as the following extracts from notices in the English press, chosen at random, show.
