WHY SWISSAIR HAS THIS YEAR NOT RESUMED ITS ZURICH-GLASGOW SERVICE.

The Summer time-table for air services came into effect on 16th April and, contrary to expectations, SWISSAIR — the Swiss Air Transport Company — has not resumed its service from Glasgow to Zurich.

This is attributable to the fact that owing to the falling-off in receipts due to the devaluation of September, 1949, SWISSAIR has been forced to take various economy measures. It has, especially, reduced or suspended certain services which brought in a small revenue only. SWISSAIR liners will, therefore, not come to Glasgow-Renfrew this year.

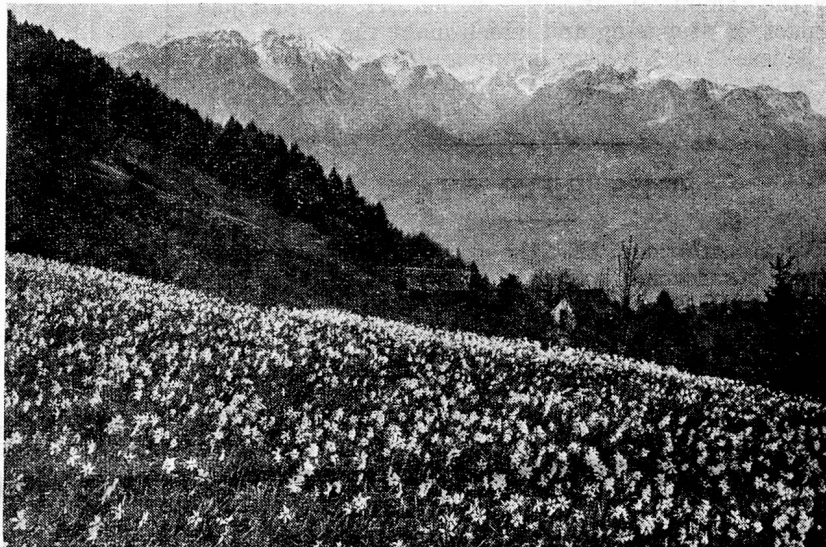
