FESTIVAL OF BRITAIN.**The Little Tin Soldiers Come to Life.**

London is to see a real live Parade of the Little Tin Soldiers for the first time at the end of July.

The famous Tivoli Guard, a boy's musical organisation, run in connection with the Tivoli Gardens at Copenhagen, will arrive by boat on July 28th, and will appear from July 30th to August 4th, daily, at the Festival Pleasure Gardens in Battersea Park.

This is the Guard's first trip outside Scandinavia since its formation a hundred and seven years ago. Their uniforms of bearskin, red tunic and white trousers, are modelled on that worn by the Danish Royal Life Guard and greatly resemble the traditional dress of Hans Anderson's famous fairy story.

The Guard number 105, mainly from 11 to 15 years of age. Of these, 37 are the actual Guards carrying the colours, 17 form a pipe and drum band, and 52 are traditional musicians. Members are recruited through Danish schools with the assistance of the music teachers, and qualify for an annual audition, after which those successful are trained for eighteen months before they enter the orchestra. The boys receive no salary, but at the end of the season receive a pocket money bonus of about 2/- per performance.

During the season at Festival Gardens they will be housed at the Clapham deep shelter.
