SWISS NATIONAL DAY CELEBRATION.

A well attended Service was held by Swiss Catholics, on Sunday 27th July, at St. Peter's Church, Palace Street, Victoria to commemorate the Swiss National Day.

His Excellency, the Swiss Minister, was present at the Service. Solemn High Mass, was sung by Father Gall, assisted by Father Emesch, and the Choir. Father Kuhne preached the Sermon in English and German. Father Gall, Father Emesch and Father Kuhne are all Missionaries of the Congregation of Bethlehem.

At the Notices Father Lanfranchi, the Chaplain, announced that the next Service would take place in St. Peter's Church, on Sunday, 21st September on the occasion of the "Jeune Federal" and that details of this service would be circularised as usual. With great satisfaction Father Lanfranchi also announced that His Eminence Cardinal Griffin, had appointed him Parish Priest of St. Anne's, Abbey Orchard Street, Westminster, where he would take up his residence at the end of September.

The Church of St. Anne, would then become the headquarters of the Catholic Mission in London.
