The Federal Council has appointed M. Robert Moret, Vice-Consul since 1939, to the post of Swiss Consul in Nantes.

M. Moret was born in 1892 in Pully and is a citizen of Ollon (Ct. Vaud). He entered the Consular Service in 1924, and occupied various posts at the Swiss Consulates in Paris, Strassbourg and Brussels.
