**MAX ALFRED KLOETZLI †**

We deeply regret to announce the passing away, on June 23rd, 1953, of Mr. Max, Alfred Kloetzli, of "The Poplars" Monument Lane, Rednal, Worcestershire, at the age of 65.

Born at Burgdorf in 1888, he came to this country in 1913, where he obtained a post with the Kalamazoo Ltd., Birmingham, in whose employment he remained for 40 years, reaching the position of Transport Manager.

Mr. Kloetzli became a member of the Swiss Club, Birmingham, soon after his arrival in England, and for the last 18 years held the post of Honorary Treasurer of this Club, to which he rendered great service. He was a very likeable man, a good Swiss, and he will be greatly missed by his many friends both in Birmingham and London.

The deceased leaves a widow, one son and a daughter, to whom we tender our sincere sympathy in their bereavement.
