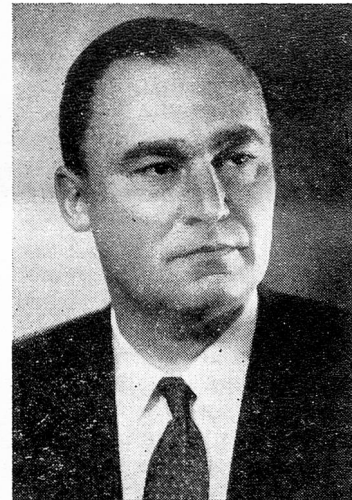

During the dinner, the orchestra from the band of the Life Guards, by permission of Lt. Colonel A. Meredith, M.V.O., commanding the Life Guards, supplied the "Tafelmusik".

Before coffee was served, Mr. de Vigier proposed the Toast to H.M. the Queen, which was followed later on by the Toast "Guests and Staff", also by the Chairman, who received an enthusiastic reception on rising.

He said:

"We are celebrating today the 21st Anniversary of our Company and I believe it is an appropriate time for all of us at Acrow to thank our many friends

for having, in the course of the past twenty-one years, entrusted us with their custom. It is thanks to the support they have given us here at home that we have been able to build up a world-wide organisation with Acrow Companies operating in sixteen countries, and with representation by top-grade agencies in seventy others. With these wide ramifications, our Organisation is constantly in the closest touch with the latest advances in construction technique in most parts of the world.

"I believe few organisations in our own field can give such a wide coverage, enabling a user of Acrow equipment to standardise, add to, and match quickly from a local supply centre near to his scene of operation. This is an advantage which many leading firms at home and abroad have come to recognise.

"Thanks are due to our many suppliers who have always endeavoured to meet our Company's very exacting requirements.

"To all Acrovians I would like to say 'thank you' for the help you have given me throughout the past twenty-one years. The Acrow of today is a reflection of your own personal achievement as part of the Acrow Team.

"Finally, I would like to say 'thank you' to the Lady on my right who, throughout twenty-one years, has had to put up with a very difficult husband, most of the time married to Acrow than to her." (Applause.)

Mr. de Vigier's address was followed by presenta-

tions to various members of the firm for conspicuous services rendered, and the announcement that Mr. R. W. Gourdie and Mr. T. A. Nanson were promoted to the Board.

The response to this Toast was made by Mr. J. Hanson, a Director of Messrs. Taylor Woodrow Limited, who very ably and humorously referred to the great progress the Company has made in the last twenty-one years, paying a personal tribute to the outstanding business capabilities of Mr. W. A. de Vigier.

After dinner the company adjourned to the gallery whilst the hall was cleared for dancing to Victor Silvester and his ballroom orchestra. Soon after 11 o'clock an excellent cabaret, entitled "Cavalcade" and supported by the George Mitchell singers, was given which was much enjoyed.

This most brilliant evening came to a close at 1 a.m., and those who were privileged to take part in this unique festival left Grosvenor House with happy feelings of having witnessed another successful milestone in the history of Acrow (Engineers) Limited.

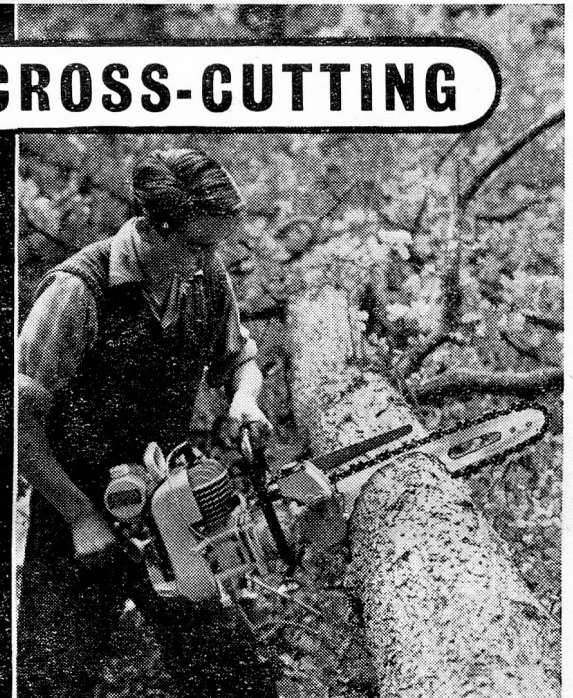
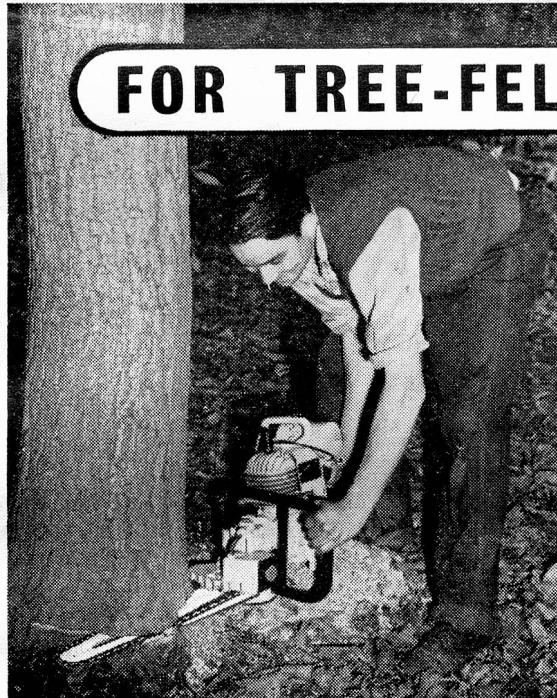
