An Appeal was sent out by the committee in May of this year (published in the "Swiss Observer" on July 12th, 1957) from which we reproduce the following particulars:

"Dear Compatriots,

The Committee of the Swiss Catholics in London have decided to hold another Bazaar at Westminster Hall on Saturday, 26th October, 1957. Our hope, therefore, is that everybody will help in one way or another, according to his or her possibilities.
