Once again death has taken from us a man who for a great many years was well known and much liked in the Swiss Colony.

Mr. J. H. Speich passed away after a heart attack on Monday, November 4th, in his 71st year, at 10, Scott Avenue, Shortlands, Bromley. He had recently met with an accident at his home, which — alas — eventually proved fatal.

Some three months ago the writer had the pleasure of paying him a visit, and found him fairly well and cheerful, although complaining of not being able to get about and visit his friends.

Ever since his retirement some two years ago he had been mostly confined to his home, where he was well cared for by his devoted wife.

Mr. J. H. Speich was born at Glarus, where he received his schooling and afterwards made a commercial apprenticeship. On coming to this country in 1908 he found employment in a Bank, and later on joined the firm of H. C. G. Feist, wine shippers, of which he became in time Managing Director. For a great number of years he travelled widely for this concern.

Our departed friend was in former years often seen at many functions in the Colony, where through his cheerfulness and gentleness he made many friends. He entered the City Swiss Club in 1909, and two years later (1911) became its President. Mr. Speich was a generous supporter of many Swiss Societies, and a Contributing Member of the Swiss Mercantile Society.

In addition to his many activities he has taken a keen interest in Masonic affairs; he was a Founder Member and Past Master of the Helvetica Lodge and has been honoured with the London Grand Rank. He was also a Past Master of the Entente Cordiale Lodge.

He leaves a widow, two sons and a daughter, to whom we extend our deepest sympathy in their loss.

We who have known Joachim Herman Speich will always keep him in affectionate remembrance, for he was a lovable man.

A funeral service was held at Elmer's End Cemetery on Friday, November 8th, and was attended by a large number of friends. ST.
