The late Dr. med. Ernst Forster, of Seengen (Ct. Aargau), has left the amount of 63,000.— frs. to various charitable institutions.

The following institutions have received legacies totalling 105,000.— frs. from the late Hermann Schreiber, of Thusis (Ct. Grisons): School Fund, Thusis, 25,000.— frs.; "Krankenhaus", Thusis, 20,000.— frs.; Children's Home, Thusis, 10,000.— frs.; Evangelical Parish, Thusis, 20,000.— frs.; Old People's Home, Thusis, 30,000.— frs.

The parish of Moenchaltorf (Uster District) has received a legacy of 10,000.— frs. from the late Sister Emma Schlumpf, for renovation of the church and church hall.

The late Mrs. Karolina Hess-Maurer, of Adliswil (Ct. Zurich), has left the amount of 30,000.— frs. to the commune of Adliswil towards the costs of erecting a home for old people.

The recently deceased Mrs. Evodie Bachofen-Hoppler, of Uster, has left a legacy of 25,000.— frs. to the "Krankenhaus" Uster. [A.T.S.]

Dr. Georg Hasler (70), of Winterthur, a former General Manager of the "Schweiz.Unfallversicherungsgesellschaft" Winterthur, and since 1957 President of the Board of the "Unfall Winterthur" and "Winterthur Leben".

Ernest Dubois (90), of Lausanne, from 1895 to 1914 editor of the "Nouveliste Valaisan", and from 1914 to 1945 editor of the "Gazette de Lausanne". He is a former member of the Grand Council of the canton of Vaud.

Willy Bretscher (60), of Zurich, for 40 years in the service of the "Neue Zürcher Zeitung" and since 1933 chief editor of that paper.

Dr. Alfred Müller (70), of Amriswil. He was a member of the Grand Council of the canton of Thurgau, and from 1935 to 1951 a member of the National Council. At present Dr. Müller occupies the posts of President of the "Bankrates" of the Swiss

National Bank and President of the "Schweiz. Hotel-Treuhand-Gesellschaft".

Jakob Bühler (75), of Schaffhausen, well-known author and journalist. Amongst his principal works are the novels "Im roten Feld" and "Yolandas Vermächtniss", and his play "Volk der Hirten". [A.T.S.]
