AN INTERESTING BOOK TO REMEMBER AN EXCELLENT LECTURE.

Many are the topics on which the London Group of the Nouvelle Société Helvétique arrange lectures during a year. Often we wish it were possible to have a tangible souvenir which would bring back to our minds some of the interesting facts and pictures absorbed in an evening, but forgotten again in the course of time. For once our wish has been granted. On Tuesday, February 26th, Monsieur André Guex, professor of French literature in Lausanne, gave an interesting talk on "The human and social aspects of the phenomenal development of hydro-electric power in Switzerland." The lecture was delivered in French and elucidated with a series of excellent slides. He told us not only of the changes which are brought about in our mountain valleys, and the material problems of the vast water power schemes but he showed us the actual construction of two plants in the Valais, and it was evident that the lecturer knew his subject extremely well.

And now we have an opportunity of refreshing our memories by purchasing Monsieur Guex's book "Barrages". It is in French and deals with the whole subject from every point of view. The book is most beautifully and richly illustrated with photographs most of which were shown at the lecture. The price is 30/-, and Mr. P. Bessire, 66, Victoria Street, S.W.1, will be very pleased to take orders. I should like to add that Monsieur Guex has kindly reduced the price of the book which is published in Switzerland at a much higher amount. Incidentally two of his works "Forerunners to Everest" and "Geiger the Glacier Pilot" have been published in English.

REGINALD BISHOP FUND.

Some time ago an Appeal was made by the Swiss Legation, for the above Fund, which was published in our issue of January 25th. Our readers will be interested to hear that the Swiss collection amounted to the very satisfactory total of £481.18.2.

Besides a gift of £100 from the "Chaîne du Bonheur", Radio Lausanne, and the generous personal contributions from many members of the Colony, a considerable number of anonymous gifts had been received.

H.E. the Swiss Minister, who was accompanied by Madame Daeniker, and Mr. F. Kung, Managing Director of the Dudley Hotel, on Saturday, March 2nd, handed to the Mayor of Hove (Ald. C. A. Clarke) the sum collected.

The Minister said "We were all greatly moved when we heard that Reginald Bishop had lost his life in trying to rescue one of our compatriots, and that unfortunately both were drowned.

"When we heard of the plight of Mrs. Bishop, we at once decided to show our appreciation of her husband by doing something to help her."

The Mayor expressed the grateful thanks of the people of Hove for this "really magnificent" tribute from the Swiss residents, which brought the total to date to between £1,600 and £1,700.
