Swiss theatres promise richly varied programmes for the coming season, the first half of which will feature many premières and a number of world premières, too. In November the Zurich Schauspielhaus (Playhouse) will be staging the first performance of "Andorra", the new work by the 50-year-old Zurich playwright, Max Frisch, and the Zurich Stadttheater (Opera House), which has given up its policy of "commercial musical comedy", has a rare treat in store for lovers of gay and cheerful entertainment, in the form of a new work called "Barmasuk" by the successful Zurich musical comedy composer, Paul Burkhard.

A visiting ensemble from the Vienna Burgtheater will be appearing in the fine Spa Theatre at Baden on 26th November; guest performances will be given by a Berlin opera ensemble in Schaffhausen's new theatre on 18th and 19th November. New French plays will be presented at performances by the Galas Karsenty and Productions George Herbert during Swiss tours. In Western Switzerland they will appear at Montreux on 19th November, at Lausanne from the 9th to the 11th, the 16th to the 18th, and from 30th November to 2nd December, and at Neuchâtel on the 14th and 15th, and 28th and 29th. They will also be visiting other towns in the course of their tour.
