## NEWS AT RANDOM

### Federal

The Swiss Legation in Baghdad has been raised to the rank of embassy, and Mr. Guido Keel has been appointed Swiss Ambassador to Iraq.

*Former South African Minister of finance, Mr. J. E. Holloway, has just been visiting our country as head of a commercial and economic mission.*

More than 8,000 drivers in Switzerland were disqualified last year, almost 60 per cent of them for drunkenness. There were 8,321 disqualifications (1,290 more than in 1959), more than half of which involved accidents. Most of the disqualifications were for periods of up to three months, but more than 100 drivers were disqualified for periods exceeding five years.

*A group of English journalists have been visiting our country's cheese industry farms and factories. The tour ended with a delightful excursion to Grindelwald.*

The first men to conquer the Eiger Mountain in winter via the dreaded North Wall, and live to tell the tale, did so after climbing only three-quarters of the total route. They denied another mountaineer's accusation that they cheated — by taking the train up the first stage of the ascent.

*Several Swiss citizens have lately been the victims of the terrorist war raging in Algeria, and the three Swiss citizens kidnapped by the F.L.N. in 1957 and 1958 are still missing, despite numerous measures taken to trace them.*

Switzerland exported 23,348 tons of cheese last year.

*Michael Mermot, 24, a Swiss student, said in Lima, Peru, that he will sail alone 4,000 miles across the Pacific in a 26-foot raft.*

Switzerland's tobacco growing industry is declining, due to common tobacco disease, floods and hailstones.

*Several people gathered with the official delegation of Pully at the local memorial to Général Guisan on 8th April to commemorate the first anniversary of his death.*

Mr. Lyndon Johnson, Vice-President of United States, was recently in Geneva attending the three-nations nuclear conference. The conference continues.

### Cantonal

The "Punch" Exhibition of British Humour on the fourth floor of a Lausanne department store is meeting with great success. Every day, it is full of visitors who chuckle appreciatively. On the same floor there is an exhibition of British furniture. Residents of Neuchâtel may have the opportunity of seeing the Exhibition in May, as negotiations are proceeding to show it at the Neuchâtel Gastronomic Fair from 10th to 22nd May.

*A Tibetan house, which will receive twenty children from that unhappy country, has been opened in the Pestalozzi Village at Trogen, Canton Aargau. The founder of the Village, Mr. Corti, Professor Carl J. Burckhardt, and world-famous alpinist Heinrich Harrer, author of "Seven Years in Tibet", were present at the inauguration, where Mr. Rakra read a message from the Dalai Lama.*

A popular petition launched by the Communist Parti du Travail has received the required 10,000 signatures. It asks for three thousand low-rented apartments.

*Switzerland's first nudist colony has just been founded in Bern. Its aim is to promote a healthy way of life with the prohibition of meat, alcohol and tobacco.*

A disastrous fire has entirely destroyed the Luederenalp hotel, above Wasen, in the Emmental region. The blaze was apparently started by a cigarette.

*The Grandson Castle, largest in Switzerland after the Château de Chillon, which was bought by Geneva's Minister Filipinetti last year, has now been restored with great care and enriched by numerous precious documents. It is now open to the public.*

The 100th anniversary of the famous Conservatoire de Lausanne will be marked this year by several special events.

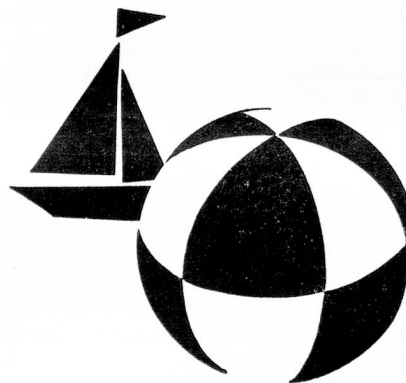
