Swiss Artists at The Royal Festival Hall

Readers may remember that we mentioned in our last issue the presentation of the B.B.C. International Light Music Festival which takes place at The Royal Festival Hall on Saturday, 10th June. The second part of the programme will include the following Swiss artists:

CEDRIC DUMONT, the Light Music Director and Conductor of the Swiss Beromünster network since 1946, was born in Hamburg in 1916. He studied conducting and composition in Zürich, France and the U.S.A., and has conducted serious and light music in practically all the countries of Europe and Overseas. He has written many compositions from ballet and film music to pop songs. He is on the board of the Swiss Performing Rights Society.

THERESE WIRTH-VON KAENEL is a popular Swiss folk song singer. She is not a professional singer, is married with two children, and proud to be a housewife. She has travelled widely on the Continent singing in Germany and France. This will be her first appearance in England.

RENATO BUI, famous Swiss accordion player, was born in 1934 at Locarno. At twenty-one he founded his own accordion school, but although he had eighty pupils, he found it difficult to live, and took a job in 1957 with a Zurich music-publishers where he works as an arranger. In addition to composing, Mr. Bui plays in the Radio orchestra of Cedric Dumont, and has two bands of his own, a rhythm group with three accordions, called the Renatos, and a modern dance band.

FRITZ BERGER and THE BASEL DRUM. Switzerland is inseparable from the Basel drum, and the drum is inseparable from Dr. Fritz Berger. The drum has been part of Swiss official celebrations since the Middle Ages. The present-day technique of this unique instrument is being taught by Dr. Berger, who is also its most enthusiastic and accomplished exponent. The drum itself can be played with great subtilty, and Dr. Berger acts as an expert judge at many festivals, as well as training the drum instructors of the Swiss Army. He has written innumerable compositions for the instrument, as well as textbooks on performance.
