**Cheers! To a memory**

They drank to the memory of Claude Debussy in London last night.

On what would have been the French composer's 100th birthday a small audience filled the Arts Council's drawing-room in St. James's-square to listen to his songs and piano pieces and crack some bottles of champagne in his honour.

It was unfortunate that John Kentish's tenor voice no longer possesses the freshness and bloom of youth. His husky tone did nothing to commend Debussy's early setting of five Baudelaire poems.

The light sentiment and rhythmic subtlety of three songs on poems by Mallarmé made a much stronger appeal.

The pianist Albert Ferber followed three familiar preludes and *L'Isle Joyeuse* with a brilliant and sonorous performance of the suite *Pour le Piano*. You could swear that the final toccata requires six fingers to each of the pianist's hands.
