NORTH OF ENGLAND

The Landsgemeinde is arranged annually by the Swiss Club Manchester in conjunction with the other Swiss groups in the Midlands and the North. This year, it will be held on Sunday, 20th June, at the traditional spot at Hardcastle Crags, about an hour's walk through lovely, unspoilt countryside. Up to 10.30 a.m. anyone interested in taking part should assemble in the Memorial Park at Hebden Bridge, about half an hour's train journey from Manchester Victoria Station. At noon, there will be picnic lunch near the Crags, which have a likeness to the Rütli Meadow, and at 2 o'clock, Professor Jean Inebnit will, it is hoped, once again conduct the Landsgemeinde ceremony which he instituted many years ago and which brings alive a little bit of Swiss history.

At 4 p.m. the walk back to Hebden Bridge begins, fol-

lowed by High Tea at the Civic Hall.

Any Swiss and their friends are made welcome, even if they are not members of any of the organising Clubs. Unfortunately, the Swiss Ambassador and Madame de Fischer will not be able to take part this year, but the First Counsellor of Embassy and Madame Marcel Heimo will be there, and it is hoped that other Swiss from the South will be able to travel to Manchester in order to take part in this unique outing.
