DEPARTURES FROM THE SWISS EMBASSY

We are pleased to announce the appointment as Swiss Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary to Indonesia and Cambodia of Monsieur Jean Revilliod, Counsellor for Cultural Affairs at the Swiss Embassy in London.

Monsieur Revilliod was born at Nyon in 1905, his place of origin being Geneva where he studied law at the University before working abroad for several years. In 1940, he was attached to the International Committee of the Red Cross in Geneva, and from 1942 to 1944, he served in the Federal Department of Public Economy. Monsieur Revilliod entered the Political Department in 1944. After a period in the Central Administration, he was posted to Peking in 1954 and later to Hong Kong and Colombo. At the beginning of 1961, he was transferred to London as Counsellor in charge of Press and Cultural Matters.

From the very first, Monsieur Revilliod took an active part in the Swiss Colony, especially in the Nouvelle Société Helvétique where he served on the Council. His many friends in this country regret his departure, but they wish him success in his new sphere of activity.

Monsieur Revilliod gave a farewell reception at the Dorchester Hotel on 22nd June.

Monsieur Hans Gallusser, First Secretary attached to the Economic Section of the Swiss Embassy, will be returning to Berne in July to take up new duties in the Federal Political Department. Monsieur Gallusser studied law and commercial science at the University of Geneva and has held posts in North Africa, Berlin, Lisbon, Baden-Baden and Tel-Aviv. Best wishes accompany him and his family.

FIRST OF AUGUST BADGES
