**THE AMBASSADOR VISITS A
SWISS FIRM IN LONDON**

On the occasion of the Annual General Meetings of the companies of the George Fischer (Great Britain) Group, the Swiss Ambassador paid an informal visit to the new London Distribution Centre of Le Bas Tube Company Limited.

Several high level Swiss executives of the George Fischer organisation were present, including Dr. M. H. Schneebeli, General Manager of the Swiss parent company, and Messrs. F. Flubacher, B. K. Greuter and C. Zehnder, members of the management.

Monsieur B. de Fischer showed keen and enquiring interest in the new installation, particularly in the very modern mechanical handling methods and, after the luncheon at the Savoy Hotel, said that he had been shown an admirable example of Anglo-Swiss co-operation, since he had seen that Le Bas distributed both the products of the George Fischer Group and those of some of the most prominent companies of the British steel processing industry.
