SWISSAIR PASSENGER SERVICE INNOVATIONS

From the beginning of April, a qualified children's nurse, wearing nurses' uniform, will be carried on all Swissair flights between Switzerland and West Africa to look after the large number of family parties and unaccompanied children travelling on these routes.

The new facility is being provided on Swissair's flights to and from Lagos/Accra, following the popularity of the nurse's services on the Abidjan/Monrovia route, where they were first introduced last year.

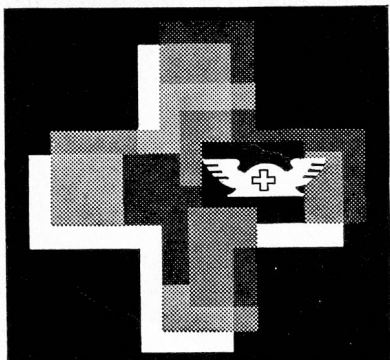

After 1st April, passengers travelling first class on Swissair services from South America to Europe will be able to choose their dinner or lunch in advance from a colourful yard-long menu listing twenty dishes and covering all courses. Among them are some Swiss specialties and dishes for children.

The meal so chosen will be served between Buenos Aires and Rio de Janeiro, or between Rio de Janeiro and Dakar. The passenger fills in his choice on a coupon attached to the advance selection menu. This coupon has to be in the hands of a Swissair office in South America five days before departure. However, an *à la carte* selection of two menus is always on board for first class passengers who have not ordered their meal in advance.

A similar advance meal selection plan has been available in first class on Swissair's North Atlantic services for some time.
