THE SWISS NATIONAL LIBRARY IN 1966

The main task of the Swiss National Library is to acquire all books published in Switzerland; the majority of these acquisitions come from gifts (88.8% in 1966 as opposed to 84.4% in 1965). In 1966, it acquired 35,518 books compared with 31,410 in 1965. Nevertheless, last year Swiss publishers produced 385 fewer titles than the previous year, especially in the field of literary works, children's books and technical publications. One important purchase we must mention is the catalogue of printed books in the British Museum, in 263 volumes.

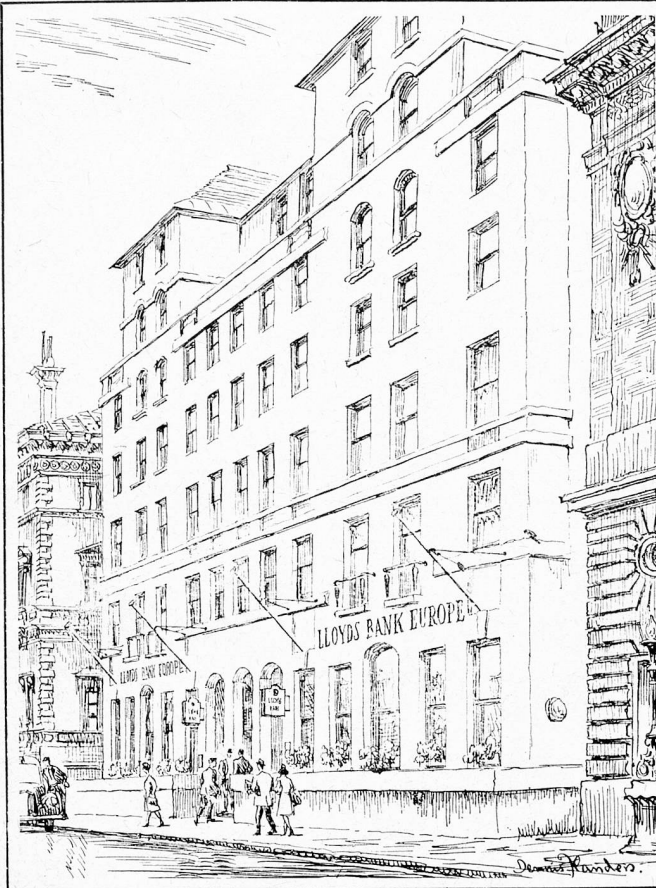
