Land hockey, is not, to be sure, a very widespread sport. It is fairly well known in countries like Pakistan, who earn their unique gold medals in this discipline at the Olympic Games. Switzerland also has a worthy record and will soon be able to show what she can do in an England v. Switzerland match to be fought at Clarence Park, St. Albans, on Saturday, 15th August, at 3.30 p.m.

Mr. N. Strofton, the Publicity Officer for the event, has sent us the following explanatory release:

This match has been arranged as part of the preparations for the European Cup Competition in Brussels from 19th September to 27th September, 1970. Both countries have been entered for this Competition. The

above match will be the first time that these two countries have met.

Shortly after this match the England Party will be leaving for a tour of Europe to play a series of matches against other European countries.

"Hockey surre Terre" as it is called in Switzerland, was first introduced in their country in about 1910 by English College students in the French part of Switzerland. The first

The Swiss Hockey Association was actually founded in 1919. Although hockey is not a particularly popular sport in Switzerland there are 23 mens clubs and 10 womens clubs. Their influence internationally has been considerable.

Switzerland was one of the seven European nations who founded the

F.I.H. in 1924, and it was Switzerland who organised the first F.I.H. International Tournament in Geneva the following year.

Up to the Second World War Switzerland ranked about 5th of all competing nations. In 1932 the Coupe Paul Leautey Trophy was awarded to Switzerland by the F.I.H. in appreciation of their work for the furtherance of hockey internationally.

Switzerland have appeared in the Olympic Games in Amsterdam (1928), Berlin (1936), London (1948), Helsinki (1952), Rome (1960).

More recently Switzerland won the Tournament in Rome in 1967 and again in 1968. Since then they have beaten Austria and drawn with Spain and lost to West Germany.

The game at St. Albans should be a very intriguing match.
