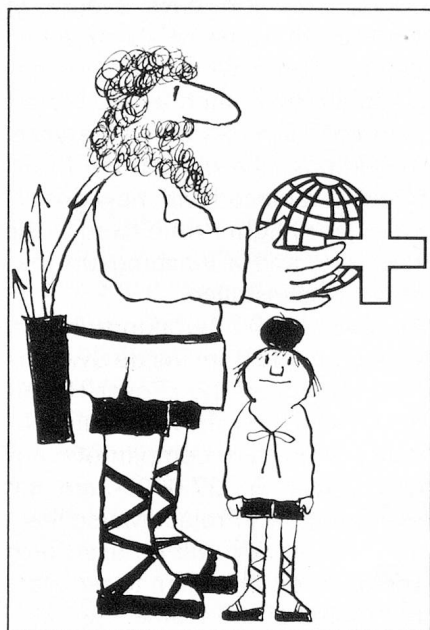

Nell'ura greiva spetta cun sprunza la leiva

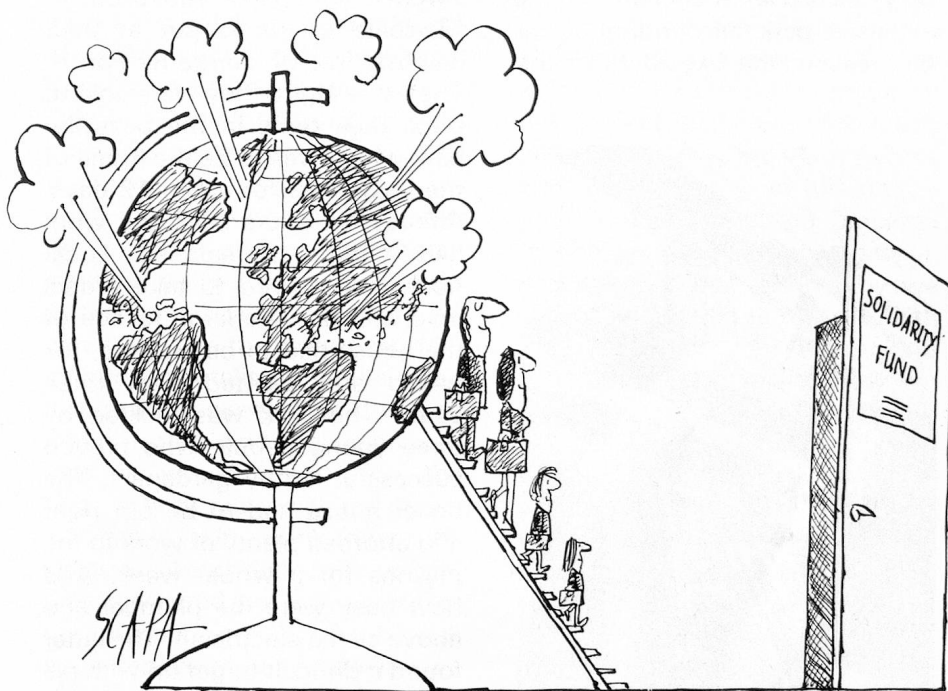
Who is going to send us similar sayings?
