Obituary

MR. JULES AMMANN

As was reported in the last issue, Mr. Jules F. J. Ammann, of 23 Hytheheld Avenue, Thorelea Road, Egham, Surrey, died in hospital on 2nd March, following a heart attack. Not knowing of this, the "Swiss Observer" had published congratulations and good wishes for his 90th birthday which was to have taken place on 30th March.

Mr. Ammann was born at Rickenbach, a citizen of Kirchberg, St. Gall. He lived in England, Scotland and Ireland ever since his arrival in Great Britain in 1909.

Jules Ammann was a very active member of a number of Swiss societies. Himself a catering expert, he was President of the Union Helvetia before the first world war and was one of the founder members of the "Lands-gemeinde" at Hardcastle Crags. He was a member of the Yorkshire Swiss Club and well known amongst the Swiss in Manchester, too.

It is to his wife and family that we express our deep sympathy in their sad loss.
