Peter Maag, the Swiss conductor was awarded the Grand Prix International du Disque Lyrique by the Academie française du disque for his recording of Ferdinando Paër's opera ''Leonora or l'Amore congiugale''. Paër, an Italian composer who was born in 1771 and died in 1839, was master of music at the Court of Napoleon from 1807 to 1812. His opera ''Leonora'' is based on the same literary source as L. van Beethoven's opera ''Fidelio'', composed some time later.

Peter Maag, who is conducting Covent Garden's current revival of Johann Strauss' opera "Die Fledermaus" made some slight arrangements to Leonora before conducting it in public and recording it.
