Capering down the Rhine

THE annual festival of the three guilds - known as Companies of Honour - of Kleinbasel, the part of Basle city on the right bank of the River Rhine, falls on January 13, 20 or 27, depending on which company is presiding.

The three emblematic figures of the companies, Griffin, Wild Man and Lion, meet up after the Wild Man has travelled down the Rhine on a raft. Their reunion takes place at midday and they dance and caper on the Central Rhine Bridge to the beat of drums.

MARKING the Patronal Festival on January 20, two huge and richly decorated cakes are borne in solemn procession to the church and later divided up among the congregation.

ON Meitlisunntig, the second Sunday in January, the girls of Meisterschwanden and Fahrwangen in the Seetal district of Aargau stage a procession in historical uniforms and a military parade before a feminine "General Staff." This is followed by a popular festival.

According to tradition the custom goes back to the Vill-mergen War of 1712. The

women of both communes are said to have given vital help that led to the victory of the Protestant Bernese over the Catholic forces of Central Switzerland

ON Epiphany, January 6, Christian customs mingle with usages which are wholly archaic and reminiscent of pagan

practices.

The noisy, money-soliciting parades constrast with the procession of the three kings with their star, illuminated from

The custom is widespread except in the canton of the Valais, where nowadays it is carried on only in the Lotschental, where the white-clad kings with a small escort, including the starbearer, "gallop" through the villages on beautifully-carved hobby horses.
