The beauty of the countryside

in which they are established helps that state of relaxation which is propitious for study.

The quality of the teaching staff has, for many decades, brought students to the region to take advantage of a training system which, within the framework of a smiling but strict

discipline, takes account of the individual needs and ambitions of each student.

As for security, this is guaranteed by a stable and democratic political system that has had the effect of giving this country a peaceful assurance of which some people are envious.
