## EVENTS

### 700th Anniversary of the Founding of the Swiss Confederation

This took place in Battersea Park on 29 June. By courtesy of the Swiss National Tourist Office we were able to occupy a large space in one of the tents. An operating model railway based on RhB practice and continuous performance of Swiss railway video films were on offer.

8000 people attended the celebrations and at times it seemed that they all wanted to get into our tent. In between meeting old members and recruiting new ones, we found ourselves answering a wide range of questions about Swiss Railways put to us by members of the general public.
